# BUMC DISCERNMENT PROCESS AND TIMELINE

Based on the feedback from Pastor John's presentations on the growing divide in within United Methodist Church, many members of BUMC believe it may be time to enter into a period of discernment about our denominational affiliation. Many factors have come to light that indicate the decision to leave or stay needs to be made now.

This is a recommendation for Bellville UMC to immediately enter a process of discernment.

We propose:

- 1. A call for church wide prayer to understand whether Bellville UMC should remain in or split from the greater United Methodist Church and if split, discern where God is leading us
- 2. Immediately enter the required period of discernment to determine for or against disaffiliation from UMC
- 3. Plan to vote for or against disaffiliation before Nov 10
  - a. If disaffiliation is chosen, then vote on a new denominational affiliation

### Our plan for discernment follows:

Form a task force for discernment using small groups to concentrate in four areas:

- PRAYER focused on understanding the spiritual element and perceiving God's will for our Church (headed by Missy Graham)
- COMMUNICATION focused on sharing with the congregation our findings and information on remaining with or splitting from the UMC, and focused on listening to feedback of our fellow believers (headed by Joe McReynolds)
- FINANCES focused on understanding financial ramifications of staying or leaving the UMC (headed by Jim O'Jibway)
- AFFILIATION focused on gathering information to seek affiliation with another Methodist denomination (for example, Global Methodist, Free Methodist, Asbury movement, or independent) (headed by Jason Samford)

Proposed Task Force Timeline:

- Phase I Research
  - o Small Groups research and gather all relevant information
  - 28 days duration
  - o Jul 27 Aug 23
- Phase II Research Compilation
  - Assess our findings
  - 7 days duration
  - Aug 24 Aug 30
  - Provide draft proposal for voting for or against disaffiliation and possible new affiliation if necessary
- Phase III Dissemination and Listening
  - Disseminate findings and information to congregation
  - 21 days duration
  - Aug 31 Sep 20
  - o Provide final proposal for voting for or against disaffiliation and potential new affiliation if necessary
- Phase IV Congregation prayer and determination
  - Time of prayer and consideration for individuals in congregation to consider proposal
  - 14 days duration
  - Sep 21 Oct 11
  - Prepare to participate in Church wide vote (all members are eligible to vote) regarding the potential of disaffiliation and potential new denominational affiliation if necessary during the Church Conference (date to be set by District Superintendent)

Future Discernment Task Force Meeting

Christ Church 4201 State Highway 6 S College Station, TX 77845 The district meeting will include three speakers.

The first will discuss the future of the UMC.

Another will discuss the Global Methodist Church (GMC).

A third who can discuss other options including Free Methodist, Congregational Methodist, African Methodist Episcopal, African Methodist Episcopal Zion, Evangelical Methodist and Christian Methodist Churches.

Clergy and church leaders are invited to attend.

### Dear Church,

As you may be aware, many United Methodist congregations are actively asking if remaining in the UMC is really the best path forward for them to follow God's call in the future. This comes following years of deep disagreements within the larger UMC and increasing numbers of clergy and bishops actively choosing to defy the Book of Discipline. The May 1, 2022 launch of a new denomination called the Global Methodist Church only further increased the number of those conversations. Tuesday, July 27, 2022 our Church Council decided we need to formally enter a period of discernment to wrestle with that very issue. We will use the time to officially seek where God wants us to have our denominational affiliation in the future as we seek to "change lives by the power of Jesus Christ."

Included in this newsletter/mailing you will find an outline of what that discernment period will look like. There will be a time of research, a time of compilation and processing that research, a time of communicating that information and listening to feedback, a formal recommendation, and then a formal season of prayer holding that recommendation before God.

While there are several possible outcomes, two of them are: 1. that we will hear God calling us to remain in the UMC and all will carry forward as is. 2. That God is calling us away from the UMC to another denominational affiliation or even none at all. If our time of discernment leads us to believe God is calling us away from the UMC, there will be a Church Conference vote at a date set by our District Superintendent (likely in mid-October). At the Church Conference, a ? majority of the members present and voting would be required for a motion to disaffiliate to pass.

Beginning immediately, the Discernment Task Force, headed by Joe McReynolds, will begin its work and more fully develop the plan of research, communication, listening and prayer. Please keep your eyes and ear open. Get informed. Let your voice be heard. This is a major decision in the life of this church, and we neer you to be a part of it.

Right now, however, begin intentionally praying for the process, for God's desire for us to be clear and compelling, and for us to move through this time in a spirit of respect and love. We may not all agree on issues that emerge but Christ calls us to love one another regardless.

If you are ready to dig into your own research, our Conference and their Future Discernment Task Force has begun to compile some great resources on their website. Begin with Bishop Scott Jones' letter here <u>https://www.txcumc.org/navigatingthewaters</u>

And also look at the work the Conference Future Discernment Task Force has already published including t first of the District information meetings found here https://www.txcumc.org/FDTF

May we emerge from this season more committed to Christ and serving him in this world.

# SAFETY / SECURITY COMMITTEE REPORT

The BUMC Security Committee Representatives are tasked by the church council with the following duties/responsibilities, as outlined in the *BUMC Emergency Response Policy and Procedures*:

- Establish/Implement the emergency response procedures
- Establish Safety Teams to implement emergency response procedures
- Identify staffing requirements for Safety Teams including off-duty Law Enforcement personnel, if authorized.
- Develop law enforcement duties, activities, responsibilities, hours, and employment
- Identify and ensure completion of required training for Safety Teams including the following:
  - Annually train Ushers/Greeters and other individuals to respond and assist members should a buildingwide emergency occur.
  - Annually schedule CPR and Automated External Defibrillator (AED) training for all BUMC staff and volunteers
  - Explore options for post-crisis response training for pastors, church staff, and members.
- Identify required emergency and safety equipment
- Strive to maintain situational awareness of current, threats, trends and practices and develop strategy, as appropriate
- Annually review Emergency Response Policy and Procedures; update as required

The Security Committee met on March 29, 2022, for the annual review of the *Emergency Response Policy and Procedures* and to discuss the roles/responsibilities/duties and administrative procedures for off-duty law enforcement officers, as authorized by the Church Council.


As many of you are aware, the number of Active Shooter Incidents have increased year-to-year, including incidents in Faith-Based Organizations/Houses of Worship (government speak for churches, synagogues, mosques, etc.). According to the FBI, "*In 2021, the FBI designated 61 shootings as active shooter incidents. In these incidents, 103 people were killed and 140 wounded, excluding the shooters. For the period 2017–2021, active shooter incident data reveals an upward trend. The number of active shooter incidents identified in 2021 represents a 52.5% increase from 2020 and a 96.8% increase from 2017." The worst church shooting in the United States occurred in 2017 at the First Baptist Church in Sutherland Springs, Texas, when a gunman killed 26 people and wounded 20, before killing himself. On June 16, 2022, a man described as an occasional attendee at services opened fire during a potluck dinner at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, killing three people. Another person in attendance subdued him until police arrived. The common attitude towards acts of violence, particularly in houses of worship, is that "It will never happen here"! There are multiple incidents that clearly indicate that attitude is false.* 

Because of the almost 200 children, volunteers and staff participating in VBS, church leadership authorized the employment of off-duty law enforcement officers and to initiate the Sunday coverage of worship services for the remainder of the year. Chief of Police Jason Smalley, Bellville Police Department, coordinates the program for the BUMC. He attended the first three Sunday worship services to assist the Security Committee in developing duties and responsibilities for the officers.

Currently, there are four local police officers who will rotate for our Sunday services and identified church-wide special events. Please introduce yourself and welcome them. Having them here, reduces the response time from minutes to seconds. In an active shooter event, seconds count, when the police are minutes away.
